Cells Facts to Know

The human body is made up of cells that are too small to be seen without a microscope. Cells come in all shapes and sizes, and can work together or alone. Cells contain a "master code" that gives all living things their own special characteristics.

- The <u>Nucleus</u> is the brain of the cell. It tells the cell what to do.
- The <u>Cell membrane</u> is the wall around the cell. It protects the cell.
- The Mitochondria is the energy source of the cell.
- The <u>Cytoplasm</u> gives the cell nutrients and water.

Cells of a similar type and function group together and form tissues, like muscle and skin tissue.

Different types of tissue come together to form our body's organs, including the stomach, heart, skin, and intestines.

Organs work together in systems, like the digestive and muscualr systems, to do the work of the body.
