Brahma: the creator Vishnu: the preserver and protector Shiva: the destroyer

The <u>Rig Veda</u> is a book that holds over 1,000 hymns and rituals for the Hindus.

A wealthy prince named <u>Siddhartha</u> gave up his wealth to teach others how to live good lives and treat others fairly. He became known as Buddha, which means, "<u>the Enlightened One</u>."

<u>King Asoka</u>, a powerful king that had conquered much of India, became a Buddhist. He felt bad for all the pain and suffering he had caused. He helped India by building hospitals, libraries, roads, and irrigation canals. Most importantly, he helped spread Buddhism across much of Asia.
